PASTOR KARL'S MESSAGE

'Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?' He said, 'The one who showed him mercy.' Jesus said to him, 'Go and do likewise.' --Luke 10:36-37

Dear Church Family,

It's probably the most well-known parable of the new testament and perhaps the entirety of the scriptures: *The Good Samaritan*. Hospitals have been named after this biblical character. And there's even a recreational vehicle group known as *The Good Sam Club* which derives its name from this universal symbol of kindness, mercy, and unconditional love.

Although many would say that the central message of this parable is to be kind to others and provide help whenever someone is in need, I find the question Jesus asks to be the truly stunning part of this story. "Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" A lot of times people misunderstand the

man who was robbed to be the Samaritan because the point of the story is about an unlikely individual helping out someone who they might normally consider to be an enemy. In Jesus' time, the Samaritans were considered outsiders by his Jewish contemporaries.

The heart of this story is the fact that the enemy is actually the one who cares for one of their own. The despised

Samaritan is the one who shows what God's love really looks like rather than the people who saw themselves as *children of God*. And Jesus' message is simple, "Go and do likewise." In other words, love your neighbor no matter what you may think of them.

This month, Pastor Jon and I will be doing a sermon series called *Love Thy Neighbor: No Exceptions* and the very heart of this message is that we as the church are called to do just like the Good Samaritan. We are called to love all of our neighbors whether we agree with them or not. In fact, showing love doesn't mean we have to agree, support, or condone, but it does mean that we are to bear the fruits of the Spirit towards all. And those fruits are *love*, *joy*, *peace*, *patience*, *kindness*, *goodness*, *faithfulness*, *gentleness*, *and self-control*.

Join us for a challenging series of sermons that will call us as the church to love our neighbors without exception. Join us for a series of sermons that will take the heart of the Jesus' ministry and put it into real action in our lives. And join us for a series of sermons that just might change what you think it means to be a true neighbor.

May God bless you in this season of thankfulness, and may you come to love God in ways that will make his love shine in your life.

Mission Trip January 17-21 to Ensenada

The Mexico Mission trip is January 17-21, and our mission is to construct finished houses in only three days and provide hope through the Vacation Bible School Program.

Shepherd's Mexico Mission is through a partnership with YUGO (Youth Unlimited Gospel Outreach). YUGO's Ensenada Outreach Center has been partnering with churches throughout the Ensenada area for years.

The Mexico Mission offers the choice of either home



construction or providing ministries to the local children through a VBS program. Any high school youth or adult can participate in either the housebuilding or children's ministry. Families who wish to attend with children 8th grade or under are welcome,



but children are under a parent's supervision at all times. There is no childcare or specific program for families attending the mission trip. There are two scheduling options available this year: 1.) You may come down with the team on Thursday, January 17, at 10:30 a.m. (suggested for construction teams), or 2.) You can come with the team leaving on Friday, January 18 at 7:30 am (VBS teams). Both teams return Monday, January 21 around 1:00 pm.






Are you Caught Up On Your Pledge?
