Love Came Down and the Earth Stood Still

Dear Church Family,

In preparation for Christmas, I've been thinking a lot about what it means to be still. Stillness has a quality about it that is different from being frozen in place. Stillness isn't about becoming statuesque or holding your breath. In fact, stillness is about breathing in all that is around us. It is about a deep awareness that can only happen when we stop moving in this or that direction. Stillness allows for us to truly see, feel, and know what is taking place.

When you stand still at the edge of the Grand Canyon, only then can you really take in all the beauty in front of you. When you stand still at the edge of an ocean, you experience the rhythm of the tides, the smell of saltwater, and the texture of the sand beneath your feet. And when you choose stillness in the presence of others, you can begin to know them in a way that goes beyond the latest social media post or particular events in their life. This is

why the Psalmist says, "Be still and know that I am God." (Psalm 46:10). He doesn't say, "Stop." He doesn't say, "Be quiet." He says, "Be still."

2018 years after the birth of Jesus, we have become less still and more frenzied. And this year, I want to invite you to the Christmas discipline of stillness. What if you were to spend a little more time being still this season, and a little



What if you were to spend a little more time being still this season, and a little less time running from place to place?

 $less\ time\ running\ from\ place\ to\ place?\ Could\ it\ change\ how\ you\ experience\ Christmas?$

I believe there was a lot of stillness at the first Christmas. Think about Mary and Joseph. Here they are in an overwhelming situation and sitting in the stillness of a moment they could barely understand. What must that have been like to hold this baby in your arms that you knew was special in a way beyond what you could comprehend? All you can do in that moment is to be still and know.

Or think about the shepherds who spent most of their time frantically running after sheep, suddenly immersed in the stillness of this young family on that cold winter's night. These young men had probably never done anything close to being still, and here they were taking in a moment they knew was so special.

Love came down from heaven at Christmas, and the earth stood still. During the next few weeks, I want you to take time to be still—even for just a moment. When you are sitting in the chaos of Christmas gatherings and events, take a literal minute to be still and know the presence of God that surrounds you. Whether it be through noisy children or an empty room. Take time to be still and breathe in God's goodness.

Prayer Ministry

Documentary: "A Rising Tide of Silence"

Friday, December 7 at 6:30 p.m. (following Centering Prayer at 6:00) MV campus Sanctuary

"A Rising Tide of Silence" is a reflective portrait of Father Thomas Keating, internationally recognized as one of today's most influential

spiritual leaders of the last 100 years. The film focuses on the Oneness of God in all of creation and the role contemplation is playing in the world. The movie was a winner at the Aspen FilmFest 2013. Fr. Keating was responsible for spreading Centering Prayer to every corner of the world through Contemplative Outreach founded in 1985. He passed away October 25, 2018. He was 95 years old. His life and teaching greatly

changed many of us at Shepherd from our first Introduction to Centering Prayer in July 2008. For our first Silent Saturday, on March 9, 2013, Fr. Thomas personally remained in prayer the entire time of the event from his home at St. Benedict's Monastery in Snowmass, Utah. He will be greatly missed.

The Thomas Keating Archive is being housed at the Pitts Theological Library of Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia. This is a strategic, university-wide program aimed at broadening and deepening the knowledge of contemplative practices of the world's religious traditions. Emory also has a relationship with His Holiness, the Dalai Lama. Emory already was teaching Centering Prayer, and Keating's *Open Mind, Open Heart* is required reading in one of the religious studies courses.

Sarah Circle will meet at the home of Gloria Rose at 1:00 p.m. on December 11.


