Dear Church Family,

As you may have heard by now, starting May 24 I will be taking a renewal leave over the summer. This is a part of the normal rhythm of ministry and United Methodist clergy are encouraged to take sabbatical leaves like this every six years. This plan has been in the works with our Staff Parish Committee, Lay Leaders, and District Superintendent, and we all determined that taking my leave over the summer would be at a time when it would have the least amount of impact on our week-to-week ministries.

While Renewal Leaves are centered around time away from the church, they are not vacations. The time away is both planned and intentional in its nature. We have planned this leave to be centered around three different areas: rest, renewal, and re-creation. During the first phase, I will be taking time away from the daily rhythms of ministry in order to decompress and experience some true sabbath time. As you know, the ministry can sometimes be a 24/7 calling, and this intentional time is meant to restore and refresh in a setting away from the day-to-day operations.

The second section of renewal will be focused on the growth and renewal of my own spiritual life and studies. We are planning some formal spiritual retreats, work with a spiritual director and continuing education opportunities in both ministry and leadership.

Finally, the closing time will be focused on what I'm calling re-creation. During this time, I'll be focused on the ministry here at Shepherd of the Hills. Part of my role as Lead Pastor is to cast vision and lead us into where God is calling our church to go next. I'll be doing some long-range planning, spending time in prayer about God's direction for us, and preparing to return to full-time ministry upon my return.

If you'd like more detailed information, I'd invite you to listen to the following podcast interview Pastor Jon and I did to help explain what a renewal leave is and what it's all about. Both my family and I are grateful for this opportunity. I look forward to the ways in which God is going to refresh my spirit in this time away, and I look forward to all that is to come at Shepherd of the Hills. During my time away, Pastor Jon will be our Lead Pastor, and our Lay Leaders will be coordinating some amazing worship services with some familiar faces coming to share the word.

Pentecost Sunday – June 9

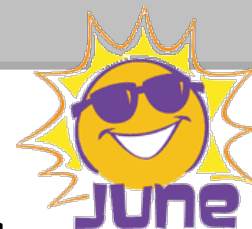
