A Crossroad of Events in February

I hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go.'

--Joshua 1:9

Dear Church Family,

These are the words of God to Joshua as he prepares to take the Israelites into the promised land. It wasn't what Joshua had expected to do. This was the job Moses was supposed to have completed, but one that did not happen before Moses' own death.

So there stands Joshua at the edge of a new start. There stands Joshua with the Israelites ready to go, the wisdom of Moses leadership imprinted upon his heart, and the Word of God himself reminding him, "[I Am] with you wherever you go."

Shepherd of the Hills, I understand a bit of Joshua's nerves as he stands at this crossroads. We as a church stand at a similar crossroads. As I've wrestled through this article's content

over the last few weeks, I've known there are three things I need to convey as we begin the annual church events of 2018, as well as the extraordinary events we have chosen to begin. And as I write, I do so knowing that God is with us wherever we go in this new year.

First, in the category of "Annual" church events, the season of Lent is almost upon us. With Ash Wednesday falling on February 14 this year, the six-week journey towards Easter will be starting soon after you read this. Lent is about a time of reflection and preparation for the good news of Easter, and this year Pastor Jon and I will walk us through the book of Revelation in our series entitled *Revelation: Nothing to Fear.* The book of Revelation gets a bad rap as a book of fear and judgment when quite the opposite is true. The book of Revelation is a

book of hope. The book of Revelation is *not* some code to unlock the meaning of today's events that will lead us to some kind of Armageddon. Revelation is a book of encouragement to those living in times that feel hopeless. Revelation is a book that spoke to Christians 2000 years ago much as it can speak to us today. It reminds us that the new heaven and new earth are with us *here and now!* We'll explore this message of hope on Sunday mornings as well as in Lenten studies throughout the week.

Second, in the category of "extraordinary" events, on February 11 we will begin a three-week capital campaign to address some of the budget issues and unexpected maintenance costs we spoke about at our last Town Hall meeting. You will be hearing more about our *Renovate* campaign during worship on Sunday mornings and through various materials we'll be releasing as the date draws near. The goal of this campaign is not simply financial, but it's about growing our church into the church God is calling us to be. Specifically, it's about making our Sunday morning experience one of deep spirituality and excellence as we seek to grow God's kingdom.

Lastly, at our Town Hall, our Lay Leaders presented three areas of focus for the upcoming year that we believe will help turn things around at Shepherd of the Hills. They are: building an excellent Sunday morning experience for our church and guests through inspiring worship, children's ministries, youth ministries, and growth opportunities; making Connecting into the Church Family an easier process for new guests; and creating more hands on service opportunities for all ages. Our Lay Leadership is already beginning this process as we continue to reset how we are resourcing our ministries financially, structuring our church, and how we are staffed as a church. Ash Wednesday Service February 14 - 7:00 p.m.

The imposition of ashes will be part of the Ash Wednesday service at 7:00 p.m. at both campuses. Lent begins with dust and ashes. We start this time of intensive preparation for baptism or realigning our lives with the vows of the baptismal covenant

acknowledging our human limitations. We remember we are dust and to dust we will return. Our efforts in this life will one day be reduced to ashes. And in the meantime,



we have deeply ingrained habits marked by sin, stained by selfishness, and resistant to our own efforts to change them.

This is why Len begins and proceeds with penitence. Penitence does not mean "feeling sorry" or "feeling guilty," though these feelings may sometimes accompany the work of penitence. Penitence as we embody it in this service and throughout this season means acknowledging where we are, owning up to it, recognizing we cannot fix ourselves by ourselves, and seeking God's mercy and power to renew us in the way of Jesus as we seek to learn to follow him either anew or more nearly.

What is Lent and Why Do We Celebrate 40 Days

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

Eucharist - First Sunday of February

Sunday, February 4, Holy Communion will be served at all worship services at both sites. Our Communion offering on Sunday, February 4, will go towards SHIP. Black History month was originated in 1926 by historian Carter G. Woodson as "Negro History Week." Woodson chose the second week of February because it marked the birthdays of two Americans who greatly influenced the lives and social condition of African Americans: former President Abraham Lincoln and abolitionist

and former slave Frederick Douglass. Woodson also founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History, now the Association for the Study of African American Life and History. In 1976, during the nation's bicentennial, the week was expanded to National Black History month. Since then, U.S.



presidents and public figures have encouraged all Americans to celebrate Black History month.


Financial Statements


