'Love Is a Relationship, Not a Transaction'

Anyone who listens to my teaching and follows it is wise, like a person who builds a house on solid rock. Though the rain comes in torrents and the floodwaters rise and the winds beat against that house, it won't collapse because it is built on bedrock. --Matthew 7:24-25



Dear Church Family,

"Love is a relationship, not a transaction." These were the words shared during one of our chapel services in Ensenada, Mexico during our recent Yugo Mission Trip. Sixty members of Shepherd of the Hills United Methodist church brought your generosity and love to 3 families and tons of kids in Canyon Buena Vista where we partner with the Arc De Noe church. And sixty people from our church family took love from a transaction to a relationship over those three days in Mexico.

The theme for the week was, "Love Is." In particular, we were challenged to not think of our mission as building a home or offering a VBS. What Jesus calls us to do is not transactional but relational. The challenge for the week was to build a relationship while we were building homes for these families and sharing a vacation Bible school with children.

Relationships are what put God's love into action. When I saw our interpreter for the week was Carlos, I didn't immediately think of his house, which was the first home build I participated in six years ago. I thought about the friendship that I have built with him over the last six years of going back to Mexico, asking how his family is doing, and realizing that the relationship we built continues as he translates for our VBS in the community. When one of our youth returned to the church in Ensenada she wasn't looking for the building where her memories of VBS happened; she was looking for the teenager she met last year and has been in communication with over the previous 12 months. She was waiting to see her face-to-face again and give her a gift that was a reminder of Christ's love at work.

When we go to Mexico representing our entire church family, we go to build relationships. In my short time at Shepherd of the Hills, we have built nearly twenty homes and touched the lives of over 500 children through these trips. But more importantly, we have shared the foundation of Jesus Christ's work in our lives and the lives of those we have met. Their faith in Jesus connected them with our church through Yugo so that they might receive an answer to their prayers for a safe home to raise their family. The foundation that keeps us all connected isn't the cement slab the house stands upon; it's the relationship with the living Christ. And it's that relationship that brings us back each year because we are building so much more than houses.

If you donated towards this mission trip, THANK YOU! If you made the journey from Orange County to Mexico, THANK YOU! And if you've ever thought about building a home with us, let me encourage you to think beyond that for next year. Join us in building more relationships centered on the solid foundation of Jesus Christ.

Mexico Mission Update

Thanks to the generous donations of our congregation we were able to build three homes this year with 15 people working on each home. Keys for home number one were given to Jose and Araceli Lopez. Jose is twenty and works in the fields. He graduated from high school, but was unable to go to college due to his father being in a serious car accident. Jose had to stay home and help support the family. Araceli is twenty-one. She only completed elementary school and then started working in the fields to help support her family. Jose and Araceli have a son, Damian born November 2018. House number 2 belongs to the Duarte Guzman Family. Raquel is a single 26-year-old mom who works in a factory and is trying to provide for her family which consists of Isaac, 10 years old, April, 4 years old and a daughter born in December. Raquel has completed Jr. High. The third house belongs to the Samorano Cruz family. Julio Samorano is 40 years old and a field worker. His wife, Laura, 33, is a housewife. They have three daughters: Elisa, 17; Carolina, 11; and Laura, 7. They are moving from a one room house where the wood has begun to rot, the roof leaks, and the foundation is dirt, to a brand-new home.

Also held was a fantastic Vacation Bible School, Friday, Saturday and part of Sunday, for the children of the community. We had 15 volunteers working with the children each day. It was a great experience.

February is African American History Month

Black History month was originated in 1926 by historian Carter G Woodson as "Negro History Week." Woodson chose the second week of February because it marked the birthday of two Americans who greatly influenced the lives and social conditions of African Americans: former President Abraham Lincoln and abolitionist and former slave Frederick Douglass. Woodson also founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History, now the Association for the Study of African American Life and History. In 1976, during the nation's bicentennial, the week was expanded to National

Black History month. Since then, U.S. presidents and public figures have encouraged all Americans to celebrate Black History month.

The 2019 theme, *Black Migrations*, emphasizes the movement of people of African descent to new destinations and subsequently to new social realities. While inclusive of earlier centuries, this theme focuses especially on the twentieth century through today.
