PASTOR JON'S MESSAGE

Dear Church Family,

Jesus said in his famous parable of the sheep and the goats, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." I don't know how many times Jesus said the words "truly I tell you" in the gospels, but I know it is a lot. When Jesus said those words, he does so to add emphasis to whatever he says next. For instance, when Jesus wants to emphasize the importance of service, he says, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." But, when he goes to the local McDonalds, he does not say, "Truly I tell you, I will have the #2, hold the cheese." He just orders his food. See the difference? The point is, when Jesus says, "Truly, I tell you," he wants us to pay attention.

In January, roughly 70 friends and members of Shepherd of the Hills will have an opportunity to enact Jesus words. We will travel to Ensenada, Mexico, where we will build houses and host a VBS for families in need, those who Jesus might consider "the least of these who are members of my family." If you are going, I hope you are preparing your body and your spirit for the adventure ahead. Lives will truly be transformed (maybe even yours). If you are not able to attend Yugo, you can still support this work. You can hold the team in prayer. You can help with much needed items for VBS. Or, you can simply make a donation. Season of Epiphany through February 26.

The season of Epiphany begins on January 6 and runs until Ash Wednesday, February 26. Epiphany Day is the day for remembering the wise men that came to worship Jesus in Bethlehem. Although we often put the wise men in our nativity scenes with the shepherds and the baby in a manager, the wise men did not arrive until much later, Jesus may have been about two years old when they arrived. The word epiphany is a Greek word that means, "to appear". The word epiphany, and the visit of wise men from far away in the East, reminds us that God has appeared in Jesus to reveal God's love to the entire world. The symbol of Epiphany used most often is the star. The star reminds us of the journey of the wise men from the East. It is interesting to note that the star is appropriate during this season and not Christmas.
